RE: County Convention Materials

The State Convention will be held at Cobo Center in Detroit on May 18th & 19th for the purpose of electing Michigan's delegates to the National Convention, as well as our National Committeewoman.

Enclosed, you will find informational and reporting materials for your County Conventions to be held on **THURSDAY**, **May 3rd at 7:30PM**. This date and time is set by state law and convention rules therefore all County Conventions MUST be held accordingly. Details on the County Conventions and a sample Call are enclosed.

PLEASE NOTE:

- O PRECINCT DELEGATE ELEVATION, either temporary or permanent, is prohibited prior to vote on State Convention Delegates & Alternates. ONLY current precinct delegates, as of the last County Convention, and At-Large Delegates may vote on State Convention delegates & alternates. (See Rule 5B, page 3 of the enclosed Rules). You may fill vacant precinct delegate spots on a permanent basis at the end of your convention, after the conclusion of all voting on state convention delegates.
- o There is a **PRECINCT DELEGATE PREFERENCE** for attending the State Convention. Those current Precinct Delegates wishing to attend the State Convention shall receive preference before a non-Precinct Delegate. (See Rule 9, page 6 of the enclosed Rules).
- o **DELEGATE LISTS SUBMITTED ELECTRONICALLY:** PLEASE use the enclosed reporting template to electronically report your Delegate and Alternate names in Microsoft Excel format. Lists should be emailed to Gary Koutsoubos at gkoutsoubos@migop.org If no one on your county executive committee has access to Excel, please contact Gary to make alternative arrangements.
- O AUTOMATIC ELEVATION OF ALTERNATE DELEGATES AT STATE CONVENTION: Alternate delegates MUST be listed in the order in which you would like the alternate delegates selected from the list should a delegate vacancy occur. For example, if a delegate from your county is absent on either day of the convention, convention officers MUST elevate the first alternate on your list to fill that spot, then the second name, then the third name for subsequent vacancies.

- PRESIDENTIAL PREFERENCE FORM: All candidates for National convention delegates and alternates MUST complete the Presidential Preference Form and return to Credentials Committee (cc: Gary Koutsoubos at gkoutsoubos@migop.org) prior to 6pm, Friday, May 18th. This form will serve as the delegate's automatic vote should they be elected to the National Convention.
- o **DELEGATE PACKETS WILL NOT BE MAILED.** Due to the short amount of time between the county and state conventions, information packets will NOT be mailed to state convention delegates. PLEASE DISTRIBUTE all necessary information (forms provided) to convention delegates at your County Convention. We will email convention information following the county conventions.

Date and Call of County Conventions

County conventions shall be held at 7:30 p.m. Local Time, Thursday, May 3, 2012 throughout the state at locations registered with the Michigan Republican Party (MRP) by Monday, April 16, 2012.

The location, time and date of the meeting of all such county conventions shall be designated in the call issued for such convention by the chair of the county executive committee (whose term of office commenced January 1, 2011), by Monday, April 16, 2012. For the purposes of these Rules, the term "county committee" shall be read to include the congressional district committees in Wayne County and the congressional district portion committees within the boundaries of Wayne County.

The county executive committee must forward by first class mail a copy of such call to the most recent Republican nominees for state legislative office, the most recent Republican nominees for county office, each precinct delegate duly elected at the August 3, 2010 primary election, and those precinct delegates elected to permanently fill vacancies at all subsequent county conventions. In addition, such call shall be sent to all Republican incumbent members of the State Legislature and the Michigan Congressional delegation, Statewide Officeholders, the Republican National Committeeman and National Committeewoman from Michigan and Michigan Republican Party Officers (see Rule 5C), where such person resides in the county in question.

A copy of the official call for county conventions must be sent to the County Clerk and the Michigan Republican Party (MRP) Headquarters, Attn: Gary Koutsoubos, 520 Seymour Avenue, Lansing, Michigan 48933, by Monday, April 16, 2012. A SAMPLE CALL IS FOUND BELOW.

If MRP does not receive the official call by Monday, April 16, 2012, the State Party Chair is authorized to rescind any call which may have been or will be issued by the chair of the county executive committee, and is further authorized to issue a call to that county convention.

The purpose of this meeting shall be to elect Delegates and Alternates to the May 18 – 19, 2012 State Convention to be held at Cobo Center in the City of Detroit. The purpose of the State Convention is to elect delegates to the 2012 Republican National Convention, and to elect our National Committeeman and Committeewoman.
Only Precinct Delegates elected at the August 3, 2010 Primary Election, the last recent Republican nominees for County and State Legislative offices, the Michigan Congressional Delegation, the Republican National Committeeman and National Committeewoman from Michigan and Michigan Republican Party Officers (see Rule 5C) where such person resides in the county in question and Precinct Delegates elected to permanently fill vacancies at all subsequent county conventions will be seated and considered eligible to vote at this convention.

 - --In counties with more than one congressional district, delegates will be asked to caucus by congressional district for Delegate and Alternate selection.
- 16. Delegates reassemble in full county convention
- 17. Delegates fill any vacancies in State Convention Delegate or Alternate slots. (NOTE: Delegates and Alternates must live in the County and Congressional District that they will represent.)
- 18. **Permanent Chairman distributes convention packets to all convention delegates and alternates** and announces convention details:
 - -- Date of the State Convention, May 18 19, 2012
 - --Convention Headquarters, Cobo Center, Detroit, MI
 - --Caucus Date and Time, May 18th at 7pm.
 - --Hotel Information, see Hotel Information Sheet
- 19. Filling of Precinct Delegate vacancies (See Rule 5B of the Rules for the Selection of Delegates and Alternates to the 2012 Republican County, State and National Conventions)
- 20. Permanent Chairman asks for any further business
- 21. A motion is made, seconded and voted upon to adjourn.
- 22. Chairman declares convention adjourned.



Report for the Committee on Permanent Organization

SAMPLE REPORT

- 5. That the Chairman of the delegation automatically fill, on a numerical basis, any vacancies in the delegation at the State Convention. (See Rule 14 of the Rules for the Selection of Delegates and Alternates to the 2012 Republican County, State, and National Conventions.)

7. That Robert's Rules of Order, Newly Revised shall govern the proceedings at this convention.

*Due to the limited time between the county and state conventions, PLEASE email, in Microsoft Excel format, your delegate forms by midnight on the evening of the county conventions. A template Excel sheet is enclosed in this packet and will be emailed to chairs and secretaries.

If you do not have access to Excel, please contact Gary Koutsoubos to make alternate arrangements to submit via fax.

DEADLINE TO RETURN REPORTING FORMS:

Rule 10 of the Rules for the Selection of Delegates and Alternates to the 2012 County, State, and National Conventions indicates that <u>Any forms not received electronically in Excel format by the MRP by 5:00 PM, Eastern Time, on Monday, May 7, 2012, will not be received and therefore will have to be presented before the Credentials Committee (see Rule 9C) prior to seating any delegate from the county convention in question.</u>

Precinct Delegate Preference

The following is an excerpt from Rule 9 of the Rules for Selection of Delegates and Alternates to the 2012 Republican County, State and National Conventions (found page 6). This subsection deals with "Precinct Delegate Preference" provision.

Please read the below language very carefully.

<u>A certified list of Precinct Delegates for your county is enclosed.</u> This list is based on the results of the August 2010 Precinct Delegate elections, and any paperwork filed following the permanent elevation of delegates at a subsequent County Convention. Those appearing on this list are eligible to receive preference.

9. METHOD OF ELECTING DELEGATES TO THE STATE CONVENTION

...In order to recognize the importance of precinct delegates, in the event that: (1) a precinct delegate duly elected at the August 3, 2010 primary election or elected to permanently fill a vacancy at a subsequent county convention; (2) attends the May 3, 2012 county convention; and (3) desires to attend the State Convention as a delegate (or as an alternate if State Convention delegate positions are filled by precinct delegates attending the county convention), then such precinct delegate shall be given preference (over a non-precinct delegate or a precinct delegate who does not attend the county convention) to be elected as a delegate or alternate to the State Convention. Between two or more such precinct delegates who attend the county convention, no preference shall be given. In order to recognize hard-working Republicans, who may not be precinct delegates, a county convention, acting as one body, may authorize the election of up to two eligible individuals per county or congressional district portion not subject to this preference, as though they were, to attend the State Convention as delegates or alternates. In counties containing more than one congressional district or congressional district portion, the actual selection of individuals to whom this preference shall be granted, if authorized by the full county convention, shall be executed in the respective district caucuses of the county convention. Under this paragraph, no preference is given to anyone who does not attend the county convention. Violation of this preference requirement is subject to challenge pursuant to Rule 9C.

Any person is eligible to run for delegate or alternate to the State Convention irrespective of whether they are precinct delegates or in attendance.

***Also, please note that Precinct Delegate vacancies CANNOT be filled prior to the election of State Convention delegates and alternates.

The filling of open Precinct Delegate vacancies may only occur at the end of the County Convention (see enclosed sample agenda).



Precinct Delegate Elevation Information Sheet

Rule 5B of the <u>Rules for the Selection of Delegates and Alternates to the 2012 Republican County, State, and National Conventions</u> indicates the following:

B. Filling of Precinct Delegate Vacancies

For purposes of filling a vacancy in precincts where no precinct delegate was ever elected, a county convention may fill such vacancy for the balance of the unexpired term by a majority vote of the precinct delegates present, provided that the vacancy shall be filled by a person who is a qualified registered elector residing in the precinct in which such vacancy occurs.

For purposes of filling a vacancy in precincts where a vacancy results from a precinct delegate, duly elected, having died, resigned, or changed voter registration out of the precinct from which the precinct delegate was elected, a county convention may fill such vacancy for the balance of the unexpired term by a majority vote of the precinct delegates present, provided that the vacancy shall be filled by a person who is a qualified registered elector residing in the precinct in which such vacancy occurs.

For purposes of filling a vacancy in precincts where a precinct delegate, duly elected, fails to attend this particular county convention or, if the convention wishes, the vacancies described above, such convention may fill such vacancy on a temporary basis for only this convention by a majority vote of the precinct delegates present, provided that the vacancy shall be filled by a person who is a qualified registered elector residing in the precinct in which such vacancy occurs.

For purposes of filling a vacancy in precincts where a precinct delegate, duly elected, is also a delegate atlarge, a county convention may fill such vacancy on a temporary basis by a majority vote of the precinct delegates present, provided that the vacancy shall be filled by a person who is a qualified registered elector residing in the precinct in which such vacancy occurs.

Where a precinct delegate vacancy is filled on a permanent basis, the convention chair and secretary shall forward such names and addresses with precincts/wards indicated to the MRP headquarters by Friday, May 4, 2012, along with the certified list of delegates and alternates to the State Convention. Failure to forward such names in this manner shall mean that the vacancy was filled temporarily.

In a county convention, the convention, acting as one body, shall determine whether to fill precinct delegate vacancies, and shall, if it shall so determine, fill such vacancies. In no event shall a precinct delegate vacancy be filled, either on a permanent or temporary basis, until after all voting for State Convention delegates or alternates is completely finished



Precinct Delegate Vacancy Reporting Information Sheet

Rule 5B of the Rules for the <u>Selection of Delegates and Alternates to the 2012 Republican County, State, and National Conventions</u> states the following:


"Where a precinct delegate vacancy is filled on a permanent basis, the convention chair and secretary shall forward such names and addresses with precincts/wards indicated to the MRP headquarters by Friday, May 4, 2012, along with the certified list of delegates and alternates to the State Convention. Failure to forward such names in this manner shall mean that the vacancy was filled temporarily."

NOTE: Precinct Delegate vacancies may ONLY be filled AFTER the completion of all State Convention delegate and alternate voting.

A <u>Precinct Delegate Vacancies Form</u> is included in an attached Excel workbook with the **Delegate Reporting Form** and the **Alternate Reporting Form**, and must be returned to the MRP along with the other convention reporting documents.

This form does not need to be returned if no precinct delegate vacancies were filled on a permanent basis.

RE: Delegate Apportionment for the 2012 State Convention

The attached Delegate Apportionment Information sheets contains a breakdown, by county and Congressional district, of the number of delegates to the May 18 – 19 State Convention.

IMPORTANT NOTE: If your county is split between one or more congressional districts, please reference both districts for the total delegate count. This applies to: Allegan, Kent, Macomb, Mason, Montcalm, Oakland, Saginaw, Tuscola, Washtenaw and Wayne counties.

The number of delegates is based upon the number of Republican votes cast for the Secretary of State in the 2010 general election as per the Rules for Selection of Delegates and Alternates to the 2012 Republican County, State and National Conventions (enclosed).

NOTE: the Governor, Lt. Governor, Attorney General, Secretary of State, Education Board members, members of Congress, the State Senate, the State House and MRP Officers are automatic, at-large delegates and do NOT need to be elected at the county conventions. Do not include these officials in your delegate lists.
